PRIVACY POLICY

This NEURAL CLAIM SYSTEMS, INC. Privacy Policy was last updated on February 21, 2022.

Your privacy is important to Neural Claim Systems, Inc., so we have developed a Privacy Policy that covers how we collect, use, disclose, transfer, and store your personal information.

By using services provided by Neural Claim Systems, Inc. and its affiliated companies, collectively referred to herein as “NCS”, you are authorizing NCS to process your personal data according to this Privacy Policy. If you do not accept the terms of this Privacy Policy, please refrain from using our websites, mobile apps, and any other NCS products and services, collectively referred to herein as “Services.”

NCS reserves the right to make changes to this Privacy Policy at any time and for any reason.

NCS will alert you about any changes by updating the “last updated” date referenced above. Any changes or modifications will be effective immediately upon posting the updated privacy policy on _____, and you waive the right to receive specific notice of each such change or modification. You are encouraged to periodically review this Privacy Policy to stay informed of updates.

1. Collection of Personal Information. Personal information is data that can be used to identify or contact a single person. You may be asked to provide your personal information anytime you are in contact with NCS. NCS may share this personal information internally and use it consistent with this Privacy Policy. NCS may also combine it with other information to provide and improve our products, services and content. You are not required to provide your personal information to NCS, but if you choose not to do so, in many cases NCS will not be able to provide you with our products or services, or to respond to any queries that you may have. The personal information that NCS may collect includes, but is not limited to:

- a. Personal Data. Personally identifiable information, such as your name, service address, email address, and telephone number that you voluntarily give to NCS when registering with or using the Services, or when you choose to participate in various activities related to NCS, including online chats.
- b. Derivative Data. Information our servers automatically collect when you use the Services, such as your IP address, your browser type, your operating system, and access times. If you are using our mobile application, this information may also include your device name and type, your operating system, your phone number, your country, your likes and replies to a post, and other interactions with the application and other users via server log files, as well as any other information you choose to provide.

- c. Mobile Device Data. Device information, such as your mobile device ID, model, and manufacturer, and information about the location of your device, when you access the Services from a mobile device.
- d. Mobile Application Information. If you access the Services using our mobile application, we may request access or permission to and track location-based information from your mobile device, either continuously or while you are using our mobile application, to provide location-based services. We may request access or permission to certain features from your mobile device, including your mobile device's other applications and features. We may request to send you push notifications regarding your account or our mobile application. If you wish to change our access or permissions, you may do so in your device's settings.

2. Use of Personal Information. The personal information collected by NCS is used as set out in this Privacy Policy. In addition, NCS may use the collected personal information to answer your demands, to send you claim information and other information regarding any claim you have with NCS and other business activities as needed. NCS may also use your personal information for our internal marketing and demographic studies, so we can constantly improve the Services we provide you and to better meet your needs. NCS may have to duplicate some of your personal data within its databases for technical reasons, or for any other reason indicated in this Privacy Policy. NCS may use your personal information and/or your IP address to enforce our End User License Agreement. In the case of misuse of the Services, NCS reserves the right to block your user account and/or your IP address. NCS may use your personal information to carry out our legal obligations, and to protect our rights and the rights and safety of our affiliated companies, other users, and employees. Your personal information may be disclosed to any relevant judiciary or administrative entity, in accordance with the relevant legal provisions.

3. Disclosure of Personal Information. NCS may share or disclose your personal information in certain situations. NCS is not responsible for the actions of third parties with whom you share personal or sensitive data, and we have no authority to manage or control third-party solicitations. If you no longer wish to receive correspondence, emails or other communications from third parties, you are responsible for contacting the third party directly. Your personal information may be disclosed as follows:

- a. By Law or Protected Right. If NCS believes the release of information about you is necessary to respond to legal process, to investigate or remedy potential violations of our policies, or to protect the rights, property, and safety of others, we may share your information as permitted or required by any applicable law, rule, or regulation. This includes exchanging information with other entities for fraud protection and credit risk reduction.

- b. Third Party Service Providers. NCS may share your information with third parties that perform services for us on our behalf, including payment processing, data analysis, email delivery, hosting services, and marketing assistance.
- c. Online Postings. NCS may post your comments, contributions, or other content that you post using the Services. These posts may be viewable by all users and may be publicly distributed outside of the Services in perpetuity.
- d. Business Partners. NCS may share your information with our business partners to offer you certain products, services, or promotions.
- e. Sale or Bankruptcy. If NCS reorganizes or sells all or a portion of our assets, undergo a merger, or are acquired by another entity, we may transfer your information to the successor entity. If NCS goes out of business or enters bankruptcy, your information would be an asset transferred or acquired by a third party. You acknowledge that such transfers may occur and that the transferee may decline honor commitments we made in this Privacy Policy.

4. Tracking Technologies. You should be aware that getting a new computer, installing a new browser, upgrading an existing browser, or erasing or otherwise altering your browser's cookies files may clear certain opt-out cookies, plug-ins, or settings. NCS may use the following tracking technologies:

- a. Cookies and Web Beacons. NCS may use cookies, web beacons, tracking pixels, and other tracking technologies with the Services to help customize and improve your experience. When you access the Services, your personal information is not collected through the use of tracking technology. Most browsers are set to accept cookies by default. You can remove or reject cookies, but be aware that such action could affect the availability and functionality of the Services. You may not generally decline web beacons. However, they can be rendered ineffective by declining all cookies or by modifying your web browser's settings to notify you each time a cookie is tendered, permitting you to accept or decline cookies on an individual basis.

5. Third Party Websites. The NCS Services may contain links to third party websites and applications of interest, including advertisements and external services, that are not affiliated with NCS. Once you have used these links to leave the Services, any information you provide to these third parties is not covered by this Privacy Policy, and we cannot guarantee the safety and privacy of your information. Before visiting and providing any information to any third-party websites, you should inform yourself of the privacy policies and practices (if any) of the third party responsible for that website, and should take those steps necessary to, in your discretion, protect

the privacy of your information. NCS is not responsible for the content or privacy and security practices and policies of any third parties, including other sites, services or applications that may be linked to or from the Services.

6. Information Security. NCS uses administrative, technical, and physical security measures to help protect your personal information. While NCS takes reasonable steps to secure the personal information you provide to us, please be aware that despite our efforts, no security measures are perfect or impenetrable, and no method of data transmission can be guaranteed against any interception or other type of misuse. Any information disclosed online is vulnerable to interception and misuse by unauthorized parties. Therefore, we cannot guarantee complete security if you provide personal information.

7. Minors. NCS does not knowingly solicit information from or market to children under the age of 13 in the United States or under the age of consent in other jurisdictions, collectively referred to herein as “Children” or “Child.” Unless stated specifically to the contrary in a given Service, the Services are not intended for Children. If you become aware of any personal data we have collected from Children, please contact NCS directly through the Services, or using the contact information listed herein.

8. Your Privacy Rights. You can ensure that your contact information and preferences are accurate, complete, and up to date by changing your information on the Services directly. For other personal information held by NCS, we will provide you with access for any purpose including to request that we correct your data if it is inaccurate or delete the data if NCS is not required to retain it by law or for legitimate business purposes. We will decline to process requests that are frivolous or vexatious, jeopardize the privacy of others, or for which access is not otherwise required by law. We may also decline aspects of deletion or access requests if we believe doing so would undermine our legitimate use of data for anti-fraud and security purposes. Online tools for the exercise of access, deactivation, restrictions, correction or deletion requests are available directly through the Services.

- a. California Privacy Rights. This Privacy Notice for California residents supplements the information contained in this Privacy Policy and applies to visitors, users, and others who reside in the state of California. Consumers residing in California have certain rights with respect to their personal information under the California Consumer Privacy Act or hereinafter referred to as the “CCPA” (California Civil Code Section 1798.100 et seq.). If you are a California resident, you have the right under the CCPA to (1) request information about the categories and specific pieces of personal information we have collected, sold and disclosed in the last 12 months, (2) request deletion of your personal information if applicable, and (3) opt out of the sharing and sale of your personal information, if applicable, and (4) not be discriminated against for exercising your rights under the CCPA.
